She is thoroughly versed in the Darwinian theory, and embraces its doctrine in her creed. She is a firm believer in Wallace's Scientific Spiritualism, and is a member of the Order of Rockrucians, the medal of which she wears.

A WONDERFUL RECORD. Her life has been one of many vicisitndes, and the area of her experiences is bounded only by the world. It is said that soon after only by the world. It is said that soon after she entered her teens, she visited this country with a party of tourists, hunted the moose in the forests of Maine, hasoosed the buffalo on the Western prairies, rode through the gorges of the Rocky Mountains, and camped with the gold seekers of California. On her return to Europe she married, and in the struggle for Italian Berty donned the belinet and the Itulian liberty, donned the belimet and the Italian liberty, donned the helmet and the gauntlets, mounted the fiery charger and fought side by side with the heroes who ranged themselves under the victorious standard of Garibaldi. She won resown for undinching bravery in many hard fought battles, and was elevated to a high position on the staff of the great general. She still bears the scars of many wounds received in the conflict, for where the fight waged fercest there the young heroine was ever to be found. Twice her horse heroine was ever to be found. Twice her hors was shot under her, and she escaped hasty death only by her

COOLNESS AND MATCHLESS SKILL Altogether Madame Blavatsky is an astor-ishing woman, and despite the life of excite ment she has led, and the scenes of danger and hardship through which she has passed, is still fuminine in her tastes, ladylike in her deportment, and fascinating in her person and ad iress. One vice only-and, if it can be called a vice, a very mild one—she acquired in camp, and that she retains to this day—she smokes. But she does it in so distinguished a manner, and is so perfect an expert in the choice of the ragrant weed, that the habit seems to lend a uits one with such a history as her's. to all this, she is wealthy, generous and in le-pendent, and, therefore, can do very much as-she pleases without exciting cuvious comment. and slanderous jealousy.

ANOTHER HEROINE. So much for the plaintiff in the suit referred to. Now for the defendant.

Madame Clementine Gerebko is the daughter of a French Count, who was high in the favor of the Emperor. At this moment her uncle is French ambassador at the British court. In 1869, when Clementine was but seventeen years old, she accompanied her father on a pleasure trip to Russia. In a short time, Count M. was recalled to Paris by the Emperor, and Clementine returned with her father to the French capital. tre of a throng of admirers. Gerebko followed her to Paris, and was cordially received. It was soon discovered that he was the favored suitor He declared his love and was accepted. A short time afterward Napoleon contered Count M. to Russia on a secret mission, and he took his daughter with him. Gerebko was also of the party, and not long after their arrival in St. Petersburg he and Clementine were mar-ried amid great pomp, all the leading nobility of the Empire being present at the ceremony. Two years ago Monsieur Gerebko and Clem-ntine came to reside in this country. They purchased a beautiful residence at Northport in Suffolk county. Here they lived very hap pily for some time.

THE OLD, OLD STORY. At length, however, Gerebko began to ab-sent himself from home, and frequently re-turned with signs of dissipation on him. He made away with large sums of money, and offered all kinds of excuses and expla merchantman sound for Austrain. Thither he has gone, declaring his intention never to return. A suit for divorce has been begun, and an order of publication procured.
