

BARON DE PALM'S FUNERAL.

The funeral of the late Baron de Palm, which is to take place at 4 o'clock on next Sunday afternoon, at the Masonic Temple, will probably be the most remarkable ever witnessed in this country. The Baron was a noted Spiritualist, and was a member of several secret orders as well as of the Theosophical Society, to which he bequeathed his fortune. He is stated to have requested before his death that "No Christian priest or minister might have anything to do with his obsequies, but that they might be purely pagan." The ceremonies will be performed in the Grand Lodge room, and will be preceded by the singing of a selection of the Orphic Hymns. Rev. O. B. Frothingham was requested to officiate, but declined to do so because he knew nothing concerning the man or the Egyptian ritual, according to the rites of which he is to be buried. The funeral will be a most extraordinary one.
