## Burlington Earnings.

CHICAGO, Ill., May 29.—The gross earnings of the Burlington Railroad for April, 1895, were \$2,477,500, and the total expenses and charges, \$2,541,786; deficit, \$44,277. For last month the gross earnings were \$2,511,758, and the total expenses and charges, \$2,612,584; deficit, \$100,825. From Jan. 1 to April 30 last the net earnings were \$40,704, as compared with a deficit of \$431,712 for the same period last year.
